Our youth have been actively living out their faith through fellowship, missions trips, and hands-on service at Greyson's Creek Nursing Home and Second Harvest Food Bank. There's something beautiful about watching teenagers pray with elderly residents or sort food for families in need – it's discipleship in action.

The American Heritage Girls are preparing for the new school year, ready to welcome girls into a year of learning, growing, and biblical fellowship. VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

A tree-mendous, "Magnified" THANK YOU to all the VBS volunteers! From the nightly meals prepared and served by the Sunday School classes to the Teachers to the Helpers, you all worked really hard to make sure that the kids had a great time! This helped the campers get excited about Jesus and learn more. This year, we had 147 registrees and 44 registered volunteers (more than 50 unregistered). And Pastor Mitch said it felt like Disney World. The kids collected over 21 pounds of pop tabs (which equals 25,000-36,000) and \$350 for Ronald McDonald House.

Mrs. Emily's and Mrs. Brittany's 2nd/3rd grade class won the honor of sliming Pastor Mitch with green slime after collecting nearly 6 lbs of pop tabs. Ms. Lynlee and Mrs. Logan's Kindergarten class was only 2 ounces from tying them. Mrs. Reida's and Mrs. Stephanie's 1st grade class collected over \$100 and each student received a carved Olive wood prayer cross from Bethlehem. One of their campers donated their tooth fairy money and several others did chores to earn money. They also wrote letters of encouragement to the families at RMH.
