Muddy Shoes

On May 10, 1864, over 250 Cadets from the Virginia Military Institute were called up for active duty to aid the Confederate Army and fight against a much larger Union Force. These men as young as fifteen years old gladly marched some 80 miles to New Market to protect the Shenandoah Valley. Once the enemy was engaged by the adult forces; they joined and entered the fierce fighting. They ran into battle. Recent rains left the freshly plowed soil a muddy trap. Their shoes were mired in Virginian Clay. They abandoned their shoes and fought shoeless! By the end of the battle while victorious against the Union forces, ten of the boys were dead and forty -five cadets were wounded. Their bravery and dedication serve as a reminder today of the courageous act of these youth. It is hard to imagine the fortitude of these young soldiers.

These boys remind us of their dedication to a cause. We are called to serve our Lord. When we joined the church, we vowed to support it by our prayers, presence, gifts, service and be a witness for Jesus Christ. Are we stuck in the field of battle? Perhaps we have left the field altogether for someone else to serve. Thank God many are serving! Faithfully working and fighting the good fight regardless of the cost. You are casting aside whatever hinders you for service for your Jesus.

Throughout February we will center our preaching about spiritual gifts. All will be given information about opportunities to serve. Sometimes we think no one really wants us. We have a lot of exciting ministry opportunities coming up!


