Children's Committee: Tina Fulcher reported they fed the homeless. We hosted a graduation ceremony for Welcome fifth graders 6/7. We also hosted a fifth grade party that evening with about 60 students attending. Great outreach.

Staff Parrish: Nathan Thanos reported that Kaitlyn Berrier is in her new official role as of this month. The committee is exploring the need for an assistant pastor. This would be a part time position. We are also looking into a church coordinator. The committee is currently working on job descriptions. Kaitlyn Berrier will work with hiring of qualified preschool employees.

May 2024



"The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in Spirit." Psalm 34:18

Sara* qualifies as one "brokenhearted"—a newer resident of this ME country, her life, like the many refugees in the area, has been one marked by famine, war, and other hardships beyond her control. Then death touched her family when her husband was killed in one of these regional conflicts, and she was fearful that her sons would suffer the same fate. Sara also has a common condition that brought her through our door—a vision impairment. Without the resources to correct this problem, people in some of the toughest places on earth are further limited in their ability to study and work to provide and care for their families. A pair of quality eyeglasses, given in the name of Jesus, can address all sorts of "blindness." So in the middle of a small church, in the heart of a poor neighborhood, in a region swelling with refugees, church pews were pushed back to allow the team of Americans and national staff to run a vision clinic (one of our most requested forms of humanitarian aid). What a fitting location to bring healing and hope!

Presumably, Sara came because she needed a pair of eyeglasses. But Rob, a volunteer trained to address both her physical needs and her spiritual needs, asked how he could pray for her. Tears welled up in her eyes as she shared her story and her fears. Rob & his interpreter were able to momentarily minister to her heart, but also to connect her to the local Cru team who can help meet her ongoing needs. Sara was invited back to the church to attend a showing of the Jesus Film Project's Magdalena—a film that portrays Jesus' tender regard for women.

Please pray for Sara (and Shiraz*, photo) to respond to Jesus in faith, and for the people like them who will be ministered to in another Unto vision clinic currently taking place in Central Asia. *names changed for security purposes.
